



WHAT DO THEY LEARN?

What do our students learn as they experience, participate and laugh in our programs? We offer several choices, but what exactly are our most popular? These are the programs that bring schools back year after year.

VOTE FOR ME - Six students run for the presidency of the Mini United States. They must win their nomination by winning delegates after winning state primaries. Eventually, the candidates choose running mates and hold a debate. Everything then comes down to the general election where they must win states to win the majority of electoral votes.

LET'S MAKE IT A LAW/LET'S MAKE IT A STATE LAW - These mirror programs for 5th and 4th grades role play the legislative process as students become representatives and senators who debate the merits of a bill as it travels the route to the president's (or governor's) desk. Along the way, they learn who the key players are at each level.

THE CONSTITUTION RULES! - This program explains the history of how the Constitution became the set of rules by which to run our country. Along the way, we find out about the Articles of Confederation and the Bill of Rights. By the way, there are 4,543 words to the Constitution, including the signatures!

SYMBOLS OF INDIANA - This storytelling program details the history and meaning behind many of Indiana's state symbols such as the flag,



state seal, the word Hoosier and more. Why is the flag blue and gold? We also offer a version of this program for national symbols.

INDIANA'S SIX - Students learn the histories and similarities of the six Hoosiers who have held the second highest office in our country. Did you know?: 5 of 6 were lawyers; 4 of 6 were representatives; 4 of 6 were in newspapers/radio? 3 of 6 were senators? 3 of 6 were governors?
